What is the Adult/Dislocated Worker Services?

The Adult and Dislocated Worker Services are funded through the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act, and provides job search assistance and retraining to individuals who are considered low income or who are receiving or eligible to receive unemployment compensation or food assistance.

The purpose of the services is to provide assistance to individuals transitioning into the workforce.

Services Available

- Employment and career coaching
 - One-on-one job search assistance
 - Resume, cover letter and application building
 - Access to exclusive job leads
 - Referral to community resources
- On-the-Job Training (OJT)
- Classroom vocational training

What is On-the-Job Training?

- A service provided to make the jobseeker more marketable to employers by offering the employer a reimbursement for training costs.
- Gives the employer the incentive to Hire, Train and Retain you!
- Does not affect your pay; a contract for a set amount of time is written directly with the employer.

Classroom Training

- Classroom training can only be approved based on funding availability, occupational employment forecasts, and demand ranking.
- Classroom training is offered on a first come-first serve basis.

Documents Required for Enrollment

- Valid Michigan driver's license or valid Michigan I.D. card
- Social Security card
- Birth certificate
- Verification of selective service registration (if applicable)
- DD214 if eligible veteran
- Verification of unemployment (if applicable)
- Verification of low income/food assistance (if applicable)

*Enrollment is required for all services, contact your local office to start the enrollment process.
