### **INTRODUCTIONS**

Members present in-person and online introduced themselves.

#### **PROGRAM**

Nikki DeWitt, Clinical Supervisor for the Ripple Effects Autism Learning Center shared information regarding the Learning Center, the organization's multiple locations, as well as the Ripple Effects Community Inclusion Center. She reported that the organization provides a broad range of services and support for the autism community and families. Individuals with autism often have behavioral challenges in social situations, and specialized staff work with autistic individuals on behavior modification and change. Ripple Effects also provides parent and caregiver training to help parents learn how to interact and work with their children around their behaviors and help them grow to be successful within the community. Ripple Effects also has an Inclusion Center in Portage that has recreation and meeting space, and it is open to the public. Ms. DeWitt also shared information about Registered Apprenticeship Programming for Registered Behavioral Technicians (RBT) and that they are currently accepting applications. A summary of the Ripple Effects services, the RBT Apprenticeship, and a link to the PowerPoint presentation was sent to DART members following the meeting.

Data reflects high pass rates for past classes as well as earning the State certification. Another CNA class is also offered in the Benton Harbor area. Registration is open to anyone with a disability related to employment, as well as individuals who have been in foster care.

# **EMERGING ISSUES RELATED TO EMPLOYMENT & ADVOCACY**

Members noted that there are multiple changes being introduced and/or implemented at the federal level, many of which are impacting, or could impact, services to individuals with disabilities. Members were encouraged to continue to contact legislators to advocate for support of programs that affect the most vulnerable. Examples provided included wages for Direct Care workers, Medicare, and Medicaid.
