APPROVAL OF AGENDA

INTRODUCTIONS

Members present in-person and online introduced themselves.

PROGRAM

Nikki DeWitt, Clinical Supervisor for the Ripple Effects Autism Learning Center shared information regarding the Learning Center, the organization's multiple locations, as well as the Ripple Effects Community Inclusion Center. She reported that the organization provides a broad range of services and support for the autism community and families. Individuals with autism often have behavioral challenges in social situations, and specialized staff work with autistic individuals on behavior modification and change. Ripple Effects also provides parent and caregiver training to help parents learn how to interact and work with their children around their behaviors and help them grow to be successful within the community. Ripple Effects also has an Inclusion Center in Portage that has recreation and meeting space, and it is open to the public. Ms. DeWitt also shared information about Registered Apprenticeship Programming for Registered Behavioral Technicians (RBT) and that they are currently accepting applications. A summary of the Ripple Effects services, the RBT Apprenticeship, and a link to the PowerPoint presentation was sent to DART members following the meeting.

Michigan Rehabilitation Services – John Fiore reported the following:

- *Summer Work Experience* – He noted that it is not too early to be thinking about Summer Work Experience. This experience is intended to be for one summer; however, it could be for a second, depending on circumstances. The intent is to get the participant into employment. - *Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA) Training* – This 10-week training class is provided through a MRS, MCTI, and Northside partnership. Data reflects high pass rates for past classes as well as earning the State certification. Another CNA class is also offered in the Benton Harbor area. Registration is open to anyone with a disability related to employment, as well as individuals who have been in foster care.

KRESA – KRESA staff were not present at the meeting; however, information provided by KRESA regarding programs and services that are offered throughout the year, as well as summer programs was shared with members via two emails following the meeting. In summarizing, career coaching and employment services for youth and young adults are provided by KRESA and include Career NOW, a Career NOW Summer Program, the MyCITY Program, and a 2Gen Summer Career and Family Program. It was noted that the application deadline for young learners interested in participating in the summer internship is March 24, 2025. However, KRESA accepts applications year round for the Career Pathway Planning Programming. The 2025 Career NOW Summer Program runs June 11 – Aug 7 and the application deadline for that program is May 9, 2025. EMERGING ISSUES RELATED TO EMPLOYMENT & ADVOCACY

Members noted that there are multiple changes being introduced and/or implemented at the federal level, many of which are impacting, or could impact, services to individuals with disabilities. Members were encouraged to continue to contact legislators to advocate for support of programs that affect the most vulnerable. Examples provided included wages for Direct Care workers, Medicare, and Medicaid.

Carrie Headworth noted that the Michigan Rehabilitation Services (MRS) brochure at the Michigan Works! Service Center in Battle Creek needs a new contact card and handout.
